**SKILL STATION INSTRUCTIONS**

**MONITOR**

Candidates will be required to pass 10 skills.

**STATION 1**

Skills PCFC1 Through PCFC 5 – Control a Flammable Gas Cylinder Fire.

SIX candidates will be sent to this station at a time (5 is the minimum).

THREE evaluators are required at this station.

Every candidate will perform the position/skill assigned. This station is designed to test the candidate's ability to perform as a member of a team.

**STATION 2**

Skills MN-1 Generator Daily Inspection (Mandatory)

VRE1 Use Cribbing Blocks (Mandatory)

VRE6 Use Reciprocating Saw or VRE7 Operate a Chainsaw

ONE candidate will be sent to this station.

ONE evaluator is required to evaluate this station.

Candidates will perform three (3) of the four (4) skills at this station.

**STATION 3**

Skills MN2 Rescue Tool Power Unit Daily Inspection (Mandatory)

MN3 Power Rescue Tool Daily Inspection (Mandatory)

VRE4 Replace and Operate a Hydraulic Rescue Tool (Mandatory)

ONE candidate will be sent to this station at a time.

ONE evaluator is required to evaluate this station.

Candidates will perform three (3) skills at this station.

STATION 4

Skill FLFC1 Assemble Equipment for Foam Stream. (Mandatory) Flowing is not required for this skill.

One of these Random Skills FLFC2 Roll on Method, FLFC3 Bank Shot Method OR FLFC4 Rain Down Method. (Application of foam must be performed).

ONE candidate will be sent to this station at a time.

ONE evaluator is required at this station.

The foam container **MUST** have the foam concentrate visible.

Candidates will complete two of the four skills at this station.

STATION 5

Skill IMS1 Initiate Incident Management

ONE candidate will be sent to this station at a time.

ONE evaluator is required at this station.

**REMEMBER:**

The candidates are required to demonstrate the skills (in accordance with the skill sheets) in a safe manner that accomplishes the objective.

Verbalization is not a substitute for demonstration.
