PREREQUISITE TO CHALLENGE TEST

1. Instructor training designed to meet or exceed the requirements defined in NFPA 1041 "Standard for Fire Service Instructor Professional Qualifications" Instructor Level II.
2. Complete and pass Instructor training designed to meet or exceed the requirements defined in NFPA 1041 "Standard for Fire Service Instructor Professional Qualifications" Instructor Level I, written and skills examination.

WRITTEN TEST MATERIALS

1. NFPA 1041 "Standard for Fire Service Instructor Professional Qualifications" Instructor Level I.
2. IFSTA Fire and Emergency Services Instructor 6th edition.
3. IFSTA Fire Department Company Officer 3rd edition.

STATE CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

No state certification available.

PRO BOARD CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

1. Pass a 70 multiple choice question written test with a 70% pass rate.
2. Complete a thirty (30) minute presentation consisting of the following:
The following items are graded:
 - Introduction (3 questions)
 - Body (7 questions)
 - Conclusion (3 questions)
 - Instructional Delivery (14 questions)
 - Training Aids (8 questions)
3. Lesson Plan Evaluation. Each lesson plan is evaluated using the following criteria:
 - Cover Sheet and Instructional Guide (2 questions)
 - Introduction (4 questions)
 - Body (10 questions)
 - Conclusion (3 questions)
 - Training Aids (4 questions)
 - Test Questions (4 questions)
4. The candidate is given his/her score at the end of the presentation. The score sheet is signed by the candidate with a place for comments.
5. National certification will only be awarded to candidates that have successfully completed both written and skills examinations.
